



RELOCATION GUIDE



Moving Checklist

Staying organized during your move can be difficult. Here's a checklist of major items to consider:

6 WEEKS OUT:

- ☐ Contact a realtor or rental service to begin your home search.
- ☐ Get estimates from movers and begin to think about how to move all of your stuff.
- ☐ If moving for work, ask what expenses your employer will cover.
- ☐ Order moving supplies like boxes, bubble wrap, tape and special containers.

4 WEEKS OUT:

- ☐ Call Bossier Parish Schools to begin the process of transferring your student. Consider getting transcripts and details on your child's school involvement to help make their transition smoother.
- ☐ Locate and make copies of your driver's license, other identification, birth certificates, medical/dental records and vet records for your pet.
- ☐ Get a change of address kit from your post office. Send your new address to friends, subscription services, creditors, bank, insurance companies and others.
- ☐ Pack seldom used items and consider what you may donate or sell before moving.
- ☐ Compare home measurements and

verify that your furniture will fit in your new home.

- ☐ Learn about what the IRS allows in terms of deductions for moving expenses.
- ☐ Transfer or identify insurance for your home and belongings in Bossier.
- ☐ Get copies of medical records.

3 WEEKS OUT:

- ☐ Contact utilities services and set a date for disconnection. Set up your new utility services in Bossier.
- ☐ Finalize travel arrangements and details with your movers.

2 WEEKS OUT:

- ☐ Review your banking and financial services.
- ☐ Make plans to transport your pets.
- ☐ Plan meals from now until your moving date.
- ☐ Plan what you need from here out and pack the rest. Consider setting aside a few dishes, towels, linens and other essentials for easy access upon arrival in Bossier.

1 WEEK OUT

- ☐ Pack suitcases for everyone with enough clothes, toiletries and necessities for a few days.
- ☐ Check the attic, garage and other storage areas for items that need packing.
- ☐ Discontinue delivery services.

A FEW DAYS BEFORE:

- ☐ Defrost your fridge and clean out the refrigerator.
- ☐ Double check details and payment with the mover or confirm plans for moving your stuff.

THE DAY OF MOVING:

- ☐ Verify details with the movers and confirm all of your items have made the journey.
- ☐ Double check your home to make sure you aren't leaving anything behind.

Your First 30 Days In Bossier

How to get connected, established and comfortable within 30 days in Bossier.

MEET YOUR NEIGHBORS.

It's possible they'll say hello before you get to introduce yourself. It always helps to know your neighbors so make sure to reach out and get to know them.

GET YOUR VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND LICENSE PLATE.

You'll need your license or photo ID, proof of insurance and purchase, loan documents, odometer disclosure statement and loan documents, if financed. Complete the application and pay the fee at the Office of Motor Vehicles (318) 741-7113.

GET YOUR LOUISIANA DRIVER'S LICENSE.

You'll need your current driver's license, social security number, 2 documents proving residency and vehicle liability insurance. Complete the application, vision exam and pay the renewal fee at the Office of Motor Vehicles (318) 741-7113.

REGISTER THE KIDS FOR SCHOOL.

Forms are available online at bossierschools.org/enrollment and you'll need proof of residence, birth certificate and immunization shot records. Schedule a parent-teacher conference to get things started off right.

LEARN EMERGENCY NUMBERS.

Print out the guide on page 10 and save these numbers in your phone as well. 911 is

always your best option but knowing the direct line to local fire, ambulance, police, etc. is always a good idea.

DRIVE AROUND AND SEE THE SIGHTS.

Bossier City and Parish have a wealth of shopping and resources. We recommend taking some time to just drive around. In Bossier City, make sure to pass along major roads like Airline, Barksdale and Benton to get a lay of the land.

FIND A DOCTOR.

Bossier is home to top hospitals and medical complexes, with specialists in most fields. Check with your health insurance and identify a doctor for you and your family nearby.

IDENTIFY NEARBY EMERGENCY CARE.

You never know when you'll have to take a trip to the emergency room or visit an urgent care facility nearby. Scout out the nearest locations to your home, work and school, just in case.

FIND YOUR LOCAL NEWS SOURCES.

Bossier is home to several radio stations and print publications. There's a list of major media outlets in the region on page 10.

IDENTIFY YOUR OFFICIALS.

If you're interested in knowing more about local politics or just getting to know your government officials, consider attending a city council or parish police jury meeting. We've got a list of local offices on page 14.

REGISTER TO VOTE.

Visit geauxvote.com for more information to register to vote and find your local polling place. You can register online or apply in person at the Bossier Parish Registrar of Voters in Benton. Make sure to bring an appropriate ID and proof of residency.

FIND YOUR PLACE OF WORSHIP.

If faith is an important part of your life, explore our local churches, temples, synagogues and mosques. Bossier and Shreveport have a wealth of places to worship so if your first selection isn't a fit, you'll likely find another right around the corner.

EXPLORE THE GREAT OUTDOORS.

Our parks and recreation system boasts playgrounds, boat launches, sports programs and special sports facilities. Each park is open from dawn to dusk. If you want to get outdoors to hike, camp or fish, we've got you covered.

EAT A TASTY LOUISIANA BITE.

Moving is a ton of work; so, treat yourself to a poboy, boiled crawfish, etouffee or another local Louisiana delicacy. If you're too tired from moving boxes, use a delivery services like On The Go Delivery or Waitr.

VISIT YOUR LOCAL LIBRARY.

Bossier Parish libraries aren't just for books! Our local librarians also host events, classes, special exhibitions and regular programs for kids and teens. You can also borrow eBooks, movies and other resources onsite or through the library's service, OverDrive.

FIND A LOCAL BANK.

Keep your money local and work with a banking professional in Bossier. Many of our local banks are involved in the community and offer great services at low costs.

SCOUT OUT JOB OPPORTUNITIES.

If you are looking for work, consider attending a job fair or reaching out to organizations like the Bossier Chamber of Commerce, the North Louisiana Economic Development Partnership or local job listings.

A Guide to:

North Bossier

North Bossier is the heart of the “boom” happening in Bossier Parish. Last month, it was reported by Sam Marsiglia, executive director of the Bossier City-Parish Metropolitan Planning Commission, that about **60 percent of the growth in the parish is coming from North Bossier**, which is considered the Benton Road-Airline Drive corridor in Bossier City.

Eleven years ago, Denise Bourgeois and her family settled in North Bossier. The couple, originally from South Louisiana, chose North Bossier because it was outside of the city and in a quiet location. Not only was the location appealing to Bourgeois, the **top-rated school system** also factored into their decision to retire from the Air Force and plant roots in North Bossier.

Now with one of her children a Airline High graduate and another attending the high school, Bourgeois remains confident in the school system she committed to 11 years ago. “My daughter attends [Bossier Parish Instructional Center] while at Airline and it gives her the chance to experience a career path of interest to her while getting exposed to alternative learning. She enjoys it so much. Plus, it gives her that collegiate feel while still in high school,” Bourgeois said.

The Bourgeois family never expected to see Bossier City expanding to their Lakewood neighborhood and beyond Wemple Road. “We liked Lakewood because of the larger lots and it is set back from the main road,” she said. “It’s nice that North Bossier is developing and expanding. I like that in North Bossier we have most of the things that I used to drive to Shreveport for.”

Airline Drive is one of the main roads through North Bossier which has businesses similar to nearby Shreveport. With local businesses and restaurants such as 2Johns, Don Juanz and plenty of one-of-a-kind boutiques for shopping, not even traffic can keep many away from in this area. “There is so much to do in North Bossier that we never had when we first moved here,” she said.

A Guide to:

South Bossier

Sandwiched between the southern tip of Barksdale Air Force Base and the Red River, lies a community called, "South Bossier," or "SoBo," if you are a Parkway High School fan rooting at a football game against a North Bossier team.

As District 1 Councilman Scott Irwin put it, "South Bossier is the best kept secret in the Ark-La-Tex." But what makes South Bossier unique is what this specific area has to offer – a connection like no other.

A drive from Shreveport across the Jimmie Davis Bridge will put you in the heart of the SoBo neighborhood. Plantation Trace, River Bend, Bellaire and Golden Meadows are just a few of the many subdivisions located in South Bossier. Most of these neighborhoods are highly sought after because of their **proximity to Shreveport, and Barksdale Air Force Base.**

Linda Huffman has lived in Plantation Trace for most of her life. Her family, like many others in Bossier, is part of the Barksdale legacy that was stationed in Bossier and have made South Bossier their home. **"I cannot imagine living anywhere else other than South Bossier,"** she said. "You get a good sense of community if you live in South Bossier. People care a lot about each other." Huffman raised her daughters in South Bossier and is now watching her granddaughters grow up and build their lives as residents in this neighborhood.

But the real draw to South Bossier is the sense of connection to nature and the people. Mike Woods, Walker Place and South Bossier Place parks have plenty of sport facilities, amenities and walking trails for family outings or gatherings. The **Red River National Wildlife Refuge**, a beautiful new wildlife refuge in Bossier City has a lake, miles of walking trails, an interpretive center and more.





The Town of Benton

As the seat of Bossier Parish, the town of Benton is making an impact on where many in our region decide to plant roots. The choice could be because Benton is a hidden gem of **small town living in our bustling regional hub**. Marcelle Tubbs first moved to Benton over 30 years ago with her husband. As a young couple, they were drawn to the affordable homes and wanted to be close to her husband's work. The couple raised three children in Benton and it is now home to two of them.

"At that time, there was one elementary school, one middle school and high school combined. During my children's life the middle school was built, and separated from the high school and now there are multiple elementary schools so that growth has been exciting," she said. "It's the neighborly relationships that make Benton a great place to live."

Tubbs also is drawn to the beauty of Cypress Lake and park mixed with city-feel of businesses and restaurants. **"Even if you do not live on the water, you can be there in just a matter of moments,"** she said.

All of Tubbs's adult children and some locals refer to Benton as "B Town". This nickname could support the town's personality and what Mayor S.G. Horton calls "friendly and inviting." Horton is new to his office after being elected just last year, however, he is not new to Benton. As a 30 year resident, Horton said he ran for mayor because he, "loved the town and wanted to keep Benton strong."

During the mayoral election, Horton said he wanted to expand and improve on some of Benton's best offerings, including the community center, city park and the **Benton Farmers Market, which runs May through July each year**. Though Benton is a small town (pop. 2,060), vendors love the big crowds that are attracted to the small town feel of this unique market, which features tons of local produce and products, a food court, live music and kids activities.

With a new mayor and businesses that support local events, Benton is showing a bright future ahead for "B Town" residents.


